1 PROJECT INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

1.1 Introduction

1. This Social Safeguards Due Diligence Report (SDDR) has been prepared for the “Livelihood & Income Generation Through Sheep/ Goat Distribution for Zhob River Basin (ZRB), Zhob, under the Balochistan Water Resources Development Sector Project (BWRDSP)”, for financing by the Asian Development Bank (ADB). The purpose of the SDDR is to identify any land acquisition and resettlement (LAR) related impacts that the subproject activities may entail and any indigenous peoples (IP) or groups (as described in ADB’s Safeguard Policy Statement 2009-SPS) whether living in the areas of present. The SDDR has been prepared by the Project Implementation Office (PIO) BWRDSP—the project implementing agency) with assistance of project design, construction supervision and implementation support consultants.

1.2 Project Background

2. The BWRDSP aims to support the government in water sector planning, management, and investment on water sector infrastructure in selected river basins. It will assist the government for investment to improve water storage and supply infrastructure at the Zhob and Mula River basins and improve agricultural farm productivity. The water resource and infrastructure development works will be implemented in territorial jurisdictions of Killa Saifullah, Zhob and Khuzdar Districts along Zhob and Mula River Basins, respectively.
3. The project will (a) construct small new dam and flood irrigation (spate) systems; (b) improve 276 km of canals, drains, and karezes (subsurface water channels); (c) develop a satellite-based water information system; and (d) build capacity of the local communities, the Baluchistan Irrigation Department (BID), and the Agriculture and Cooperative Department (ACD). The indicative outcome of the BWRDSP project will be to improve land and water resources, agricultural production and farm income.
4. The BWRDSP is a five years project, where Asian Development Bank (ADB) has provided \$100 million sector loan, \$ 5 million JFPR and HLTF and the Government of Baluchistan funds \$ 31.14 million for investment on water sector infrastructure, capacity building and project management components.

1.3 Project Description

5. Balochistan is the largest province of Pakistan in terms of area and smallest in terms of population. It abounds and to a great extent excels in variety and subtlety of culture and tradition, climate and vegetation, geology, relief, and resources. It is reckoned to be comparatively less developed, and the sole reason is scarcity and paucity of water.
6. Islamic Republic of Pakistan received a loan (3700-PAK) from the ADB for financing the BWRDSP. The project will support implementation of the integrated water resources management policy of the Government of Baluchistan (GoB). The policy

provides a comprehensive framework for the province to address the issues of water management and development in the context of basin approach, with water harvesting and groundwater recharging as an integral part of watershed management.

7. The project preparatory technical assistance consultants (hereinafter called ‘the TA Consultants’) prepared the BWRDSP (TA 8800-PAK, 2016-2018) followed by ADB’s approval of a loan (3700-PAK) in the amount of \$100 million from its Ordinary Capital Resources, and by Japan Fund for Poverty Reduction (JFPR), a grant of \$5.0 million (administered by ADB) in 2018. The TA Consultants assisted the GoB in screening and ranking of the five potential river basins (Hingol, Mula, Pishin, Loralai and Zhob) and selecting the two river basins and identifying 11 sub-projects for development.
8. GoB has now hired the services of the Consultants for Project Design, Construction Supervision, and Implementation Support for BWRDSP (hereinafter called ‘the Consultants’) will help GoB in preparing detailed design of three core sub-projects and also feasibility studies and detailed design of balance of eight non-core sub-projects as listed in Table 1.

1.4 Objectives of the Project

- The overall objective of the BWRDSP is to support the government in water sector planning, management and investment on water sector infrastructure in selected river basins. The main objective of the subproject are:
 - Employment Generation and Mutton & Wool Production.
 - Food Security; and
 - Poverty Reduction.

1.5 Livelihood & Income Generation through Sheep/ Goat Distribution and its Scope

10. The scope of the works for this component includes” “Livelihood & Income Generation Through sheep/goats Distribution for Zhob River Basin” under the

Balochistan Water Resources Development Sector Project (BWRDSP)", as per survey, design, layout and cost estimates prepared by the Agriculture & Cooperatives department. The subproject shall be completed by the PIO in association with Livestock and Dairy Development Department, Government of Balochistan. The scope of the subproject is to provide 1 package of 10 sheep/goats to one poor and deserving female selected as per criteria. 69 Nos. of cases were to be selected for the project incentives.

1.6 Location of the Subproject

11. The scope of the subproject includes the provision of goats to the deserving and selected females as per criteria of Zhob River Basin area under JFPR grant. In Zhob River Basin (ZRB), District Zhob, 69 females were selected as per selection criteria. Before implementation of this proposed selection criteria, a joint visit of all stakeholders including Project Implementation Office (PIO) Officials, BWRDSP Consultants along with Livestock and Dairy Development department was conducted to validate the established criteria from October 2022 to November 2022. The objective of the joint visit was to make interaction with female applicants, visit their sites/houses to check suitable environment for goats keeping and viability of the criteria at ground in the pilot sites for the selection of female applicants. The summary of field visits is provided in section 4.1 in detail. The photographs of the meetings and consultation are provided in Annexure I.
12. The departmental staff, based on the approved selection criteria, identified the females/ sites fulfilling the eligibility criteria and advised the Consultants to prepare documents and cost estimates for these applicants.
13. According to planned program and project target as per selection criteria, 69 applicants/beneficiaries were to be selected in Badinzai and Tora Darga, Zhob project area. Due to exhaustive efforts through frequent visits to convince their male members to create awareness and motivation to reduce their poverty, At first they were reluctant due to fear of loan and recovery by force, but they were briefed that this is not a loan, it's a financial support and not returnable. Then 132 showed their interest and applied for the incentives. After scrutiny of applications, 69 females were selected who fulfilled the selection criteria. The status of the applications is as below:

* The grant budget is limited. These are the poorer families. They can not afford 10 % even in kind equal to Rs. 29000. They have not excess commodity.

14. Thus, this SDDR has been prepared for 69 female applicants as per ADB trust under JFPR grant in the Zhob River Basin subproject area, District Zhob.

1.6.1 Criteria for selection of deserving females for keeping goats through Project

15. Female applicants eligible for keeping goats through Project must meet the following criteria:

- The applicant should reside in the area of Zhob subproject approved for this component.
- The applicant must possess Computerized National Identity Card (CNIC).
- The applicant takes interest in keeping goats but cannot afford to purchase.
- The female applicant will be provided training in livestock sector outside the house.
- The applicant should not have already more than 5 numbers of goats.
- She should not be a defaulter from any Govt/Private department.
- She has not got benefits earlier from any project or NGO.
- She will be in a Contract agreement with Livestock department, PIO or any other authorized female staff to check or inspection the applicant and goats.
- She is agreed to share 10 percent of the total cost of sheep/goats in cash or kind.
- The applicant will agree to look after the sheep/goats provided by the project at least for one year.

1.6.2 Applications and Agreement Contract

16. A sample agreement of Urdu version signed by the applicant verified by the livestock department and approved by the PIO-PMO is provided in the Annexure II. The Contract agreement have been signed individually with all female applicants.

1.7 The Sub-Project Components

17. The package comprised total 10 Goat (Boer)/Sheep (Balochi, Rakhshani and Bibrikh) up to 6-month age. (01 male and 09 female) to each selected and approved female applicant for ZRB area. The details of procurement of one package for one applicant is provided below:

The applicant will share 10 % of the total cost to create sense of ownership and responsibility.

2 PURPOSE AND MEHODOLOGY OF DUE DILIGENCE

2.1 Purpose and Methodology

18. The ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS) 2009 (for IR policy) aims to "avoid involuntary resettlement wherever possible or to minimize impacts, if avoidance is not possible by exploring project and design alternatives; enhance or at least restore livelihoods of those affected by the project relative to pre-project levels and to improve the standards of living of those poor and other vulnerable groups. Following this aim of the SPS, the proposed project has been carefully conceptualized to either avoid all potential social impacts of proposed subproject where possible or keep impacts to insignificant thresholds through adopting no or least impacts project designs. Following this concept, the social safeguard team undertook due diligence of the proposed project to assess the land acquisition and resettlements (LAR) impacts of the project, screen the project, and categorize them under the SPS's projects categorization criterion for involuntary resettlement (IR) and indigenous peoples (IP) impacts, prepare land acquisition and resettlement plans (LARP) as required and compensate all DPs prior to starting of construction work.
19. The SDDR team has worked closely with the design team with the objective of adjusting the design to avoid or minimize the likely impact. The PIO, Consultants team and Livestock & Dairy Development department ensured that the proposed project does not involve LAR and IPs impacts because 10 Goat (Boer)/Sheep (Balochi, Rakhshani and Bibrikh) up to 6-month age to be provided by the project will be kept in the private owned courtyard or adjoining the residence and there will be no impact on other asset or property.
20. In order to achieve this objective, the social team followed the following methodology undertaking the social due diligence of the proposed/selected subprojects.
- Review of available information including SPS 2009, project design components;
 - Field site visits along with the PIO staff and design team to identify and assess LAR impacts and how to minimize them through opting different design alternatives;
 - The project staff of PIO, Consultants and local community discussed on LAR impacts, sought their views and clarifications on the project design, gaps and the safeguard requirements to address the impacts. The action required from the PIO was explicitly discussed and got their commitment over the actions needed along with timelines. Regular follow-ups through meetings, emails, and formal letters to complete or implement timed measures;
 - Recording of baseline site situation by taking photos and google coordinates of project sites as evidence of site visits and baseline impacts; and
 - Public consultations with the local residents, applicants, in the close proximity of project site and PIO to seek their views on the project and to discuss probable project impacts and mitigation measures.

3 FINDINGS OF DUE DILIGENCE WORK

21. Key findings of social safeguards due diligence work are presented below:

3.1 Involuntary Resettlement (IR) Category

3.1.1 Land Acquisition

22. As per ADB Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS-2009), the LAR impacts are considered significant if 200 or more persons experience significant impacts that are physically displaced from housing and lose 10% or more of their income-generating resources.
23. The proposed project does not involve LAR impacts because 10 Goat (Boer)/Sheep (Balochi, Rakhshani and Bibrikh) up to 6-month age to be provided by the project will be kept in the private owned courtyard or adjoining the residence and there will be no impact on other asset or property.
24. Will require only 07 kanals (0.88 acre) land owned by the 69 female owners. Only 02 marla (544 sft) land of each female applicant will be required to keep 10 sheep/ goats in her house yard. The applicant is a sole beneficiary of the scheme provided by the project based on an agreement attached. The 10 Goat (Boer)/Sheep (Balochi, Rakhshani and Bibrikh) up to 6-month age will be kept on the applicant's land as per individual agreement signed by her cannot be considered as the voluntary land donation (VLD). This small piece of land will not be utilized for the community. The list of the deserving/vulnerable and approved females is provided in Table 2.
25. The applicant will spare/ provide 02 marla of land for her own interest and benefits. This land will not be considered "donation" as donation means things/property for the welfare of other people.
26. The project is categorized as the IR category C. The IR checklist is given in **Annex-III**.

3.2 Indigenous Peoples (IP) Category

27. The project component "Livelihood and Income Generation of Females through Provision of sheep/goats" is located in Zhob River Basin (ZRB), Zhob district which was surveyed to identify any IP/groups in and around the subproject area. However, no designated tribal communities or ethnic population groups with secluded culture or socio-economic settings different from the mainstream population of the country were found existing in the subproject area. Pakistan's constitution provides equal rights to all its population and there is no law or policy available that distinguish the population of project area into distinguished population IP groups. Furthermore, people of the subproject area too, do not recognize themselves as IPs. Moreover, subproject intervention does not affect any relocation and migration of the people due to keeping 10 Goat (Boer)/Sheep (Balochi, Rakhshani and Bibrikh) up to 6-month age on 02 marla of small piece of land. Hence, the subproject is classified as category "C" for indigenous peoples safeguards and therefore, no IP framework or a plan is required for the subproject. The IP checklists are reflected in **Annex-IV**.

3.3 The Project Area

28. The project is located in District Zhob. The area selected for the scheme is Badinzai and Tora Dargah including other settlements Shankhai Ghundai, Marofzai, Tatozai, Tora Shah, Salmanzai, Lasizai, Wannaji, and Bob-e-Erabzai. These sites can be accessed from the Zhob city through matled road at a distance of 20-30 km. Private transport is the main source of social mobility. The area is dependent on rain. Most of the crops are sown dependent on rain and at few locations, tube wells are installed due to shallow depth. Solar scheme under BWRDSP is also being launched for the small farmers in this area.

3.4 Gender and workplace environment

29. To ensure gender inclusiveness in the project area, equal employment opportunities for all sexes i.e., male, female, and transgender will be ensured and appropriate measure to provide gender supportive and harassment free environment will be created. The Gender expert of PIO have also reviewed the report and will oversee the gender issues to resolve.

3.5 Health and Safety

30. It is understood that the applicant will keep the facilities neat, clean and in good environment condition. Environmentally, the surroundings should not be affected by the applicant. No need to undertake adequate security measures and protocols to ensure health and safety of users and staff.

4 STAKEHOLDER CONSULTATIONS

31. Stakeholders' involvement is an important feature of the preliminary assessment and can lead to better and more acceptable decision-making regarding the project design and implementation. Therefore, stakeholder consultations with the relevant department were carried out.

4.1 Objectives of Consultation

32. The consultations were conducted with the local people residing in the adjacent villages of the proposed component. The discussions focused on the proposed scheme for the local community's interests related to income generation activities of the poor women.

4.1.1 Consultation with the Women

33. The people of the area were pleased to know about the proposed grant. "Livelihood & Income Generation of Females Through Goat (Boer)/Sheep (Balochi/Marriwal, Rakhshani and Bibrikh) up to 6-month age" for Zhob River Basin" under the Balochistan Water Resources Development Sector Project (BWRDSP)", will be much beneficial for the local poorer and vulnerable females to boost their economic condition due to project support. They were of the view that after the project support, their income will be increased resultantly, poverty will be reduced. The photographs

of few meetings are provided in the Annexure I. The important general objectives of the consultation process were:

- Conducted door-to-door visits of Village/killi Badenzai and Tora Dargah where FGDs with women community members were planned. Interviewed 132 female applicants and asked about the given questionnaire and value-added livestock through value chain development at the HH level and 10 % share which is mandatory while providing the grant. Further, discussed the below points:
- Briefly defined to women community members about livestock production and caring at the HH level.
- Discussed capacity building of the women community members on livelihood-related training.
- Explained in detail the purpose of GAP to women community members to understand the role of gender in society. The Gender staff of Consultants and PIO are also fully involved to achieve the targets of GAP.
- Briefly defined the community to ADB-JFPR project means to eradicate poverty and empower women at the community level. It especially emphasizes engaging females in agri-business.

4.1.1 Findings

- Due to heavy rain and flood in the area, most of the houses were affected.
- Most of the community lost their livestock and damaged their irrigated land.
- After the flood, the community faced issues of drinking water.
- Women requested for community hall where they sit and discuss their problems.
- The social team of consultants needs regular follow-up once the project activities are started.
- There is a need to enhance the capacity of women in different areas, especially in the livelihood sector.
- There will be need of periodically check the livestock by the livestock department.
- Overall, the women showed their satisfaction on the project to provide sheep/goats to the poor females to increase their income.

4.1.2 Suggestion

35. For the smooth implementation of the ADB Trust JFPR grant, participants made following suggestions:

- The implementation activities should be started as early as possible and must be completed within given time period;
- If possible, the rejected applicants, who can't afford 10 % of their share, must be considered for eligible to reduce the poverty in the area.

4.2 Institutional Arrangement

36. Project Implementation Office (PIO) is the Executing Agency (EA) for the ADB Trust JFPR grant and PMO has overall responsibility of project implementation. The PIO will implement this activity of the ADB Trust JFPR HVA Grant No.9197-PAK with the help and coordination of the Livestock and Dairy Development department.

37. A project implementation Office (PIO) have been established to implement grant execution. Within the Social and Environment Safeguard Unit (SESU) have been created to manage all LAR related activities involved under the implementation of the subproject. In addition, PIO will be supported through Project Design and Supervision Consultants for the project during grant, implementation and monitoring.

38. As the PMO-PIO will be overall responsible for the delivery on safeguards management, hence at PMO-PIO level, a Social Community Development Expert have been appointed to oversee and monitor land clearing and resettlement related issues and coordinate ADB safeguards management team throughout project implementation period.

39. The PIO with the help of Livestock and Dairy Development department will be responsible for the implementation of the Sub-project. The PD (PMO) and DPD PIO through the Social and Environment Safeguards Unit (SESU) will be responsible for the implementation of the subproject.

4.3 Unanticipated Impacts

40. The PIO and SESU will identify any unanticipated safeguards (LAR) impact during the implementation of the project. If any such impacts are found, these will be addressed according to approved LARF and ADB's SPS policy 2009.

5 CONCLUSION

41. The SDDR team based on the findings of the due diligence work makes the following conclusion and recommendations for the project implementation.

42. The subproject includes “Livelihood and Income Generation through Distribution of sheep/Goats” to the poor, vulnerable and selected women in ZRB, Zhob area does not involve any land acquisition.
43. The public consultation revealed that all the stakeholders are in favor of proposed grant component considering it positive step for increase the income of poor females to reduce poverty.
44. The sub-project includes “Livelihood and Income Generation through Distribution of Kamori Goats” about 07 Kanals of land will be required by 69 female applicants. However, landownership will not be changed. The land owners are agreed on it. Also, no indigenous people recognized within or nearby the project area.
45. Therefore, it has been categorized as “Category C” for Involuntary Resettlement and same fall in “Category C” for Indigenous Peoples. However, since the subproject does not involve any land acquisition, therefore no LARP is required to be prepared.

6 RECOMMENDATIONS

46. The SDDR team based on the study findings makes the following recommendations for implementation before any construction activities commence.
47. In case of any unanticipated LAR impacts emerging during project implementation or there is a change in the project design that involves any LAR impacts, the EA will inform ADB about it and immediately prepare a LARP in accordance with SPS and LAA and implement and monitor LARP. Such LARP will be implemented and monitored in accordance with SPS before start of construction work. LARP implementation will need to be validated and report accepted by ADB for construction work.
48. A Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) at subproject level will be established at subproject level before implementation of subproject. The committee will comprise a representative of Livestock department, PIO, and a local male for resolving any concerns or grievances they may encounter while keeping the goats. The follow up meetings with the applicants/ beneficiaries are in progress to hold a general meeting to elect GRC members. Keeping in view the local culture and traditions, it would be better if a male is included in all GRCs to support women and to convey their concerns and issues to the relevant forum.

However, the PIO and LDD department should monitor the applicants to support in case of animal theft, animal disease and other related issues.

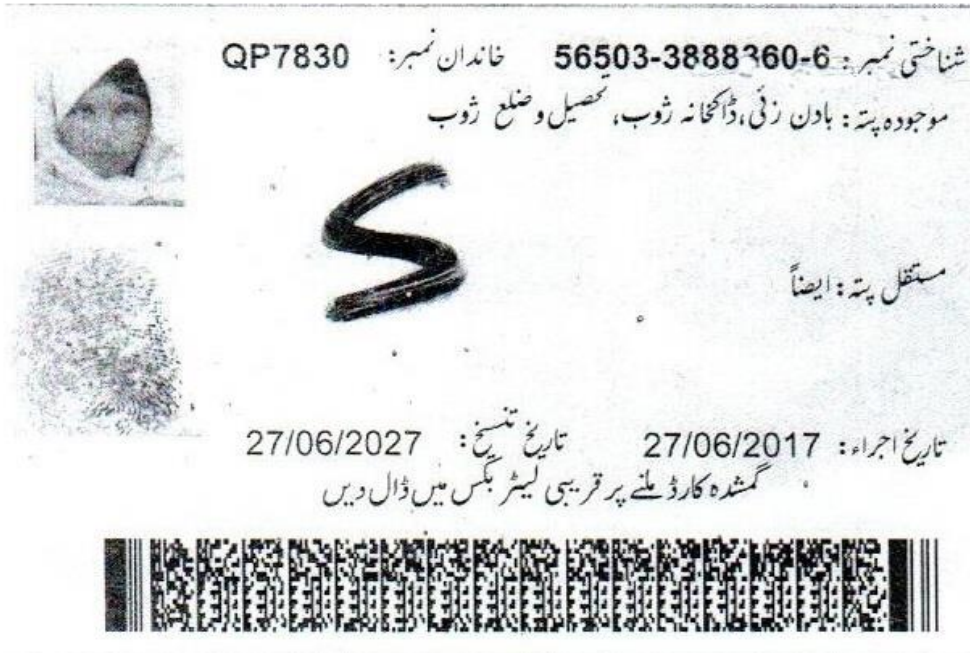

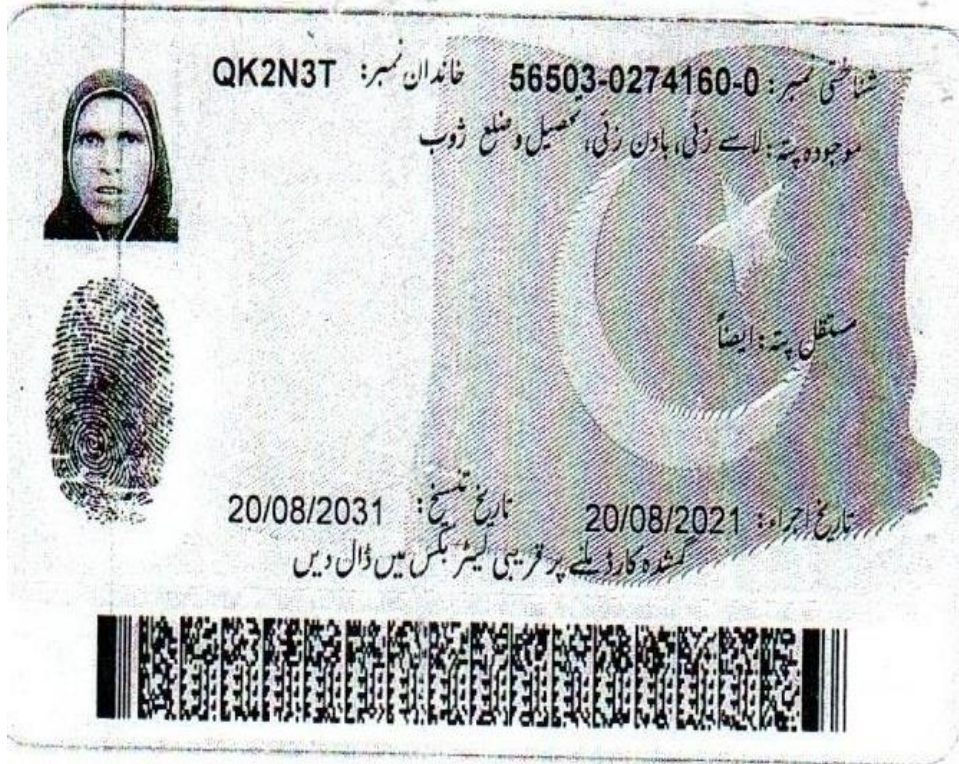


