1 INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

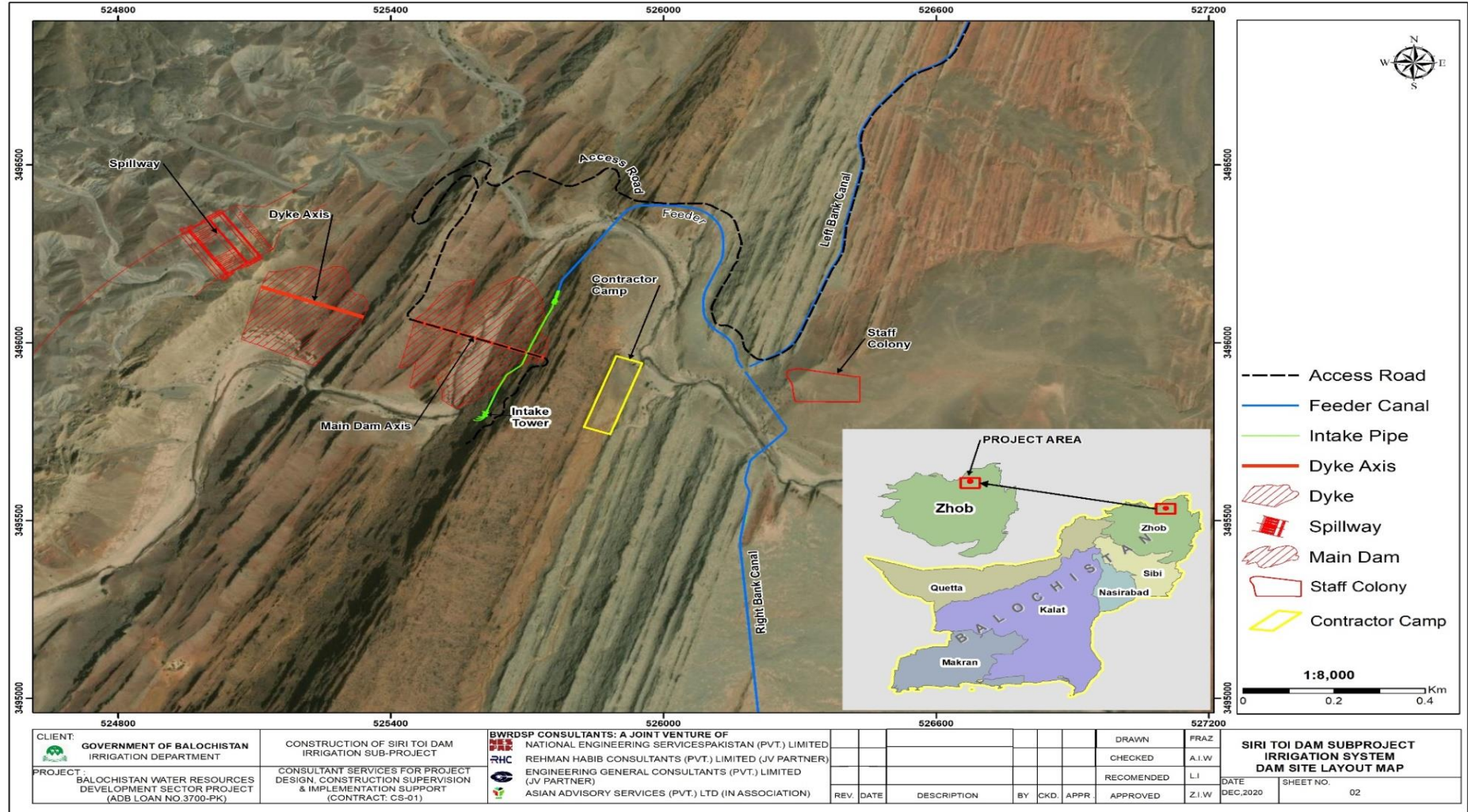
1 The Balochistan Water Resources Development Sector Project (BWRDSP) aims to support the government in water sector planning, management and investment on water sector infrastructure in selected river basins. It will assist the government in investment to improve water storage and supply infrastructure at the Zhob and Mula River basins and improve agricultural farm productivity. The water resource and infrastructure development works will be implemented in territorial jurisdictions of Killa Saifullah, Zhob and Khuzdar Districts along Zhob and Mula River Basins, respectively.

2 The project will (a) construct new small dams and flood irrigation (spate) systems; (b) improve 276 km of canals, drains, and karezes (subsurface water channels); (c) develop a satellite-based water information system; and (d) build capacity of the local communities, the Balochistan Irrigation Department (BID), and the Agriculture and Cooperative Department (ACD). The indicative outcome of the BWRDP project will be to improve land and water resources, agricultural production and farm income.

3 Government of Balochistan (GOB) has engaged the services of the Consultants for Project Design, Construction Supervision and Implementation Support for Balochistan Water Resources Development Sector Project (hereinafter called 'the Consultants) will help GoB in preparing detailed design of three core sub-projects and feasibility studies and detailed design of balance of eight non-core sub-projects

4 This updated SDDR has been prepared for unsettled land of 1005 acres belonging to GoB, as part of Siri Toi Dam subproject. The location map of the sub-project is shown in Figure 1-1.

2 PROJECT IMPACTS

5 As the land data provided by the Revenue Department Zhob indicated that out of total 1093 acres land to be acquired for the construction of Siri Toi subproject, 1005 acres (92 %) land is unsettled land in different components. Only 81 acres (8%) of land is registered as private ownership.

2.1 History of Un-Settled Land in Balochistan

6 The tribes and sub-tribes in Balochistan have settled in different areas of Balochistan for centuries with internal arrangements on respective shares in land/area. The collective identity of the tribes and sub-tribes remained intact by having a long-standing possession and control over these lands, collecting and distributing rents, and deriving benefits therefrom. Large tracks of lands are being used as grazing fields since their forefathers. In some forest regions, there are well-established systems for sharing of timber royalties among the tribe's members. According to the Land Revenue Act of 1976 and the Settlement Manual, provincial government conducts settlement proceedings periodically, but huge tracks of waste lands still remain unoccupied as Article 172 of the Constitution of Pakistan considers unclaimed lands as ownership of government, although some case laws pertaining to the ownership of un-settled lands have been adjudicated by the Courts of law differently.

3 PROJECT COMPONENTS

3.1 Land With and Without Land Acquisition and Resettlement (LAR) Impacts

7 **Land having LAR impacts:** Total land required for Sri Toi Dam Project is 1093 acres, of only 81 acres are in the settled land owned by 113 HHs who have been affected by the land acquisition. A Land Acquisition and Resettlement Plan has been prepared and approved to compensate the AHs of land. They are being compensated based on the approved LARP that is currently under implementation.

8 **Land without LAR Impacts:** Of the total 1093 acres of land, 1005 acres of land is completely free from LAR impacts as this land is "unsettled" land owned by GOB. All 1093 acres of land has been acquired for the project by GOB through the Land Acquisition Act 1894. The Revenue record and Section 5 clearly indicated that the land is barren, unproductive and banjer qadeem. Moreover, during resettlement survey, no impacts on structures, crops trees and other public /community structures was found. No leaseholders, tenants, encroachers or squatters on this land will be affected.

9 Project component wise detail of land "with and without LAR impacts" is provided in the table 1 below:

3.2 Project Components without LAR Impact

10 The unsettled land owned by GOB is in the dam reservoir, RBC & its distribution system & LBC and its distribution system. The land is completely free from LAR impacts including any encroachments or third-party use or claims and therefore, can be handed over for construction. The detail of unsettled land is provided in the Tables 2, 3 and 4 below:

3.6 Changes/VOs due to Site Requirement and Community Needs

12 Based on the required changes in the design, community & department needs, request was made to ADB for the approval vide “**Appropriation Request No. ICB-01/01 (Construction of Siri Toi Dam Subproject, Zhob)**”. The following works were proposed to be constructed.

- I. Change in design of D/S slope of main dam embankment, having no LAR impacts
- II. Change in design of slope protection of main dam and Dyke, having no LAR impacts
- III. Change in design of spillway structure and provision of plum, having no LAR impacts
- IV. Change in design of (i) access road from shingle gravel to metalled road and provision of additional link road to outlet structure having no LAR impacts and (ii) rehabilitation of existing killi Hazrat Sahib road and surfacing of road along LBC service road having no LAR impacts.

13 The proposed revisions/changes in the design (i-iv above) do not have any LAR impacts. Construction activities will be carried out on the unencumbered government owned unsettled land that has already been handed over to the project for construction work. Under item no. iv, the upgrading of existing road from Killi Hazrat Sahib (Ahmad Khel) will be within the existing width of right of way (ROW) that is government owned, and it does not have any encroachments to clear. Similarly, a portion of a new road along the LBC service road will also be constructed on the land already acquired and possessed for the project works. That too will not have any LAR impacts or issues.

4 NEED FOR SDDR

14 This due diligence was originally conducted in the month of September and December-2021 but was updated in April, May June 2024 to incorporate the proposed changes in the design of the project components (details provided in items i-iv of para 20) and provide a detailed assessment of the proposed changes if causing/not causing any LAR impacts and based on impacts categorization and preparation of a resettlement plan, if required. However, the updating of the SDDR confirmed that the proposed changes/revisions are free from any LAR impacts as the proposed works would be undertaken on the unencumbered land, already acquired, and the government owned ROW with the land and ROW being free from any LAR impacts or issues.

4.1 Safeguards Categorization of Unsettled Land under Siri Toi Dam Subproject

15 After conducting a detailed social screening of the proposed revisions and changes in the design of the project components, the social team of PMO and PMC classified the revisions/changes as category C for Involuntary Resettlement (IR) and Indigenous Peoples (IP) based on no LAR impacts and no presence of any ID groups in the areas of project components that will have the proposed design changes implemented after clearance of the SDDR by PMO and ADB.

16 The civil works on Unsettled land may be classified as “Category C” both for involuntary resettlement (IR) and Indigenous Peoples (IPs). If any unanticipated impacts arise during the project implementation, the project will report to ADB of the occurrence of such impacts and will follow the requirements of the SPS and project LARF. The ADB checklists for IR and IP are provided in Annexes III & IV.

4.2 Complaint from People of Killi Hazrat Sahib

17 A complaint from Killi Hazrat was filed with PMO and ADB from a community member from Killi Hazrat (name not mentioned due to public disclosure). He expressed concerns over the village road allegedly damaged by the heavy machinery of the project contractor and other concerns related to the camp site waste, rent and royalty of camp office land and the quality of work. PMO has met with the complainant twice and is trying to address his concerns with the involvement of Deputy Commissioner Zhob and Contractors.

5 CONSULTATION WITH THE PARTICIPANTS (MALES/FEMALES)

18 Consultations were held with the participants of three killies. Project interventions were discussed in detail and questions/concerns were raised by the participants. The summary of consultation is provided in the following Table 7.

5.1 Consultation with Female Participants

19 During the reporting period, introductory/preliminary meetings were held with female groups to share the project interventions.

- All the participants actively participated in the meetings. Gender sensitivities and causes of poverty were discussed in detail.

- Due to strict local culture, females do not find job opportunities in the project related work opportunities. They take care of household matters whereas their male counterparts work outside to earn bread and butter. However, under a project grant program, females in the project area have been supported with livestock support to help them in improving their livelihoods. There is a number of beneficiary women who are rearing livestock with support they received from the project's grant money.

5.2 Pressing Needs of Women

20 During consultations women expressed following pressing needs:

- Supply of clean drinking water and sanitation facilities;
- Provision of electricity in sub-project areas;
- Access roads and public transport facilities;
- Trained lady health visitor;
- Participation of women in income generation activities; and
- Vocational Training Centre.

5.3 Consultation with Male Participants

21 During the reporting period, following males were contacted to discuss project interventions. The outcome of the meetings is provided in the following: The list of participants is provided in Annexure-V and VI. While Stakeholders Engagement Plan (SEP) has already been submitted in April 2024 covering their concerns and mitigation measures.

5.4 Common Issues (Pressing Needs) of Male Community in the Sub-Project Area

- Worst condition of access road;
- No Government interest to improve educational facilities;
- Lack of electricity in the area; and
- Lack of health facilities.

6 GRIEVANCES REDRESS MECHANISM (GRM)

6.1 Structure & Procedure of Grievance Redress Mechanism

22 The project has a multi-tier GRM with designated staff responsibilities at each level. These tiers are District/ Project Management Office (PMO)/ Project Implementation Office (PIO) Level

23 The purpose of Grievance Redress Committees (Mula and Zhob river basins) is to resolve grievances and complaints DPs/local people. The GRC comprises of the following members:

- Deputy Project Director (DPD)/EXEN, PMO/PIO as head/convener of GRC;
- Senior Sociologist-Female, PMO/PIO; act as secretary of GRC
- Land Acquisition Collector (LAC) as Member;
- Resettlement Specialist;
- Environment Specialist of SC (PMO Support) and

- Any notable personality from the area to be nominated in writing by the relevant District Administration in consultation with the community.

24 Note: Representative from any other Department may be called as and when required by the GRC. Environmental Specialist of SC will join GRC meeting related to Environmental issues only.

25 The GRC will meet once a month and when the need arises. The GRC will review grievances involving all LAR planning and implementation, environmental issues (water, Air, Noise pollution etc.) and social issues including, compensation, relocation, and other assistance as well as social issues that may arise due to restricted access to the resources and amenities.

26 GRC will perform following functions:

- Record grievances, categorize and prioritize the grievances that need to be resolved by the committee and solve them within a month;
- Summon and hear aggrieved persons/parties to produce evidence of their claims and record their viewpoint;
- Communicate its decisions and recommendations on all resolved disputes to project executors and the aggrieved persons for implementation;
- Forward the unresolved cases to GRC-BID/project level within an appropriate time frame with reasons recorded and its recommendations;
- Develop an information dissemination system and acknowledge the aggrieved parties about the development regarding their grievance and decision of GRC-BID/project level;
- Maintain a complaint register accessible to the stakeholders with brief information about complaints and GRC decision with status report; and,
- Maintain complete record of all complaints received by the GRC with actions taken.
- BID/ Project Level.

6.2 Displaced Person Committee (DPC) / GRC at Village-Level

27 Because project impacts are not recorded on private people regarding land, structure, crop and tree, there is no need to form Displaced Person Committee (DPC). A GRC at Village-Level will be established to record and resolve the concerns and issues of the local peoples.

28 DPC have been notified via Letter No. PD/BWRDSP/2020/1028-1040DPC dated 30th December 2020 (notification attached as Annex-VI) and will comprise of the following members;

- Social/Community Organizer of SC (male/female);
- Female member; and
- Two male members (local)
- Environment Specialist of SC (Design Team)

6.3 District/ Project Management Office (PMO) / Project Implementation Office (PIO) / Basin Level

29 Balochistan Irrigation Department (BID) shall constitute a Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) headed by Deputy Project Director (DPD) at District/PMO/PIO level for each river basin i.e Zhob & Mula to resolve all grievances and complaints of the DPs and the complainants. GRC have been notified via Letter No. PD/BWRDSP/2020/1002-1014 dated 30th December 2020 (notification attached as Annex-VII) and shall comprise of the following members:

- Deputy Project Director (DPD)/EXEN, PMO/PIO as head/convener of GRC;
- Senior Sociologist-Female, PMO/PIO; act as secretary of GRC
- Land Acquisition Collector (LAC) as Member;
- Resettlement Specialist;
- Environment Specialist of SC (PMO Support) and
- Any notable personality from the area to be nominated in writing by the relevant District Administration in consultation with the community.

30 Note: Representative from any other Department may be called as and when required by the GRC. Environmental Specialist of SC will join GRC meeting related to Environmental issues only.

31 The GRC will meet once a month and when the need arises. The GRC will review grievances involving all LAR planning and implementation, environmental issues (water, Air, Noise pollution etc.) and social issues including, compensation, relocation, and other assistance as well as social issues that may arise due to restricted access to the resources and amenities.

32 GRC will perform following functions:

- Record grievances, categorize and prioritize the grievances that need to be resolved by the committee and solve them within a month;
- Summon and hear aggrieved persons/parties to produce evidence of their claims and record their viewpoint;
- Communicate its decisions and recommendations on all resolved disputes to project executors and the aggrieved persons for implementation;
- Forward the unresolved cases to GRC-BID/project level within an appropriate time frame with reasons recorded and its recommendations;
- Develop an information dissemination system and acknowledge the aggrieved parties about the development regarding their grievance and decision of GRC-BID/project level;
- Maintain a complaint register accessible to the stakeholders with brief information about complaints and GRC decision with status report; and,
- Maintain complete record of all complaints received by the GRC.

6.4 BID / Project Level

33 BID shall constitute a Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) at BID/ project level. The committee will have following composition:

- Project Director/ Chief Engineer, as head/ convener of GRC;
- Member from Social Safeguards (female) Unit BID;
- Representative of the Land Directorate as member;
- Representative of the Legal Department as member; and
- Representative of the Balochistan Environment Protection Department as member.

34 This GRC-BID/project level, through authorized representative, will acknowledge the complainant about his complaint, scrutinize the record of the GRC-PMO/PIO/basin, investigate the remedies available and request the complainant to produce any record in favor of his claim. After thorough review and scrutiny of the available record on complaint, visit the field and collect additional information, if required. Once the investigations are completed, the GRC-BID/project level shall give the decision within 30 days of receipt of the complaint. If the complainant is still dissatisfied with the decision, he can go to the court of law, if he/she wishes so.

35 Gender representation will be ensured by inducting a female member in both GRCs. The mechanism will ensure the access of DPs to a GRM that openly and transparently deals with grievances and makes decisions in consultation with all concerned that are consistent with SPS-2009 and country safeguard system.

6.5 Formation of GRC of Siri Toi Dam Subproject

Disclosure of GRC Mechanism and Its Formation

36 The Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) is a vital mechanism established at the local level to ensure that community concerns and issues are addressed promptly and effectively. Comprising members from the local community. The GRC provides a platform for residents to voice their grievances and resolve issues related to project activities. By empowering the community to take ownership of resolving local issues, the GRC helps prevent disruptions to project timelines.

37 In this regard, a meeting was arranged in Killi Hazrat Sahib on June 2, 2024. The community has nominated respected individuals including a female to serve as GRC members, ensuring that concerns are heard and addressed in a fair and transparent manner. This collaborative approach fosters trust, promotes social cohesion, and contributes to the project's success.

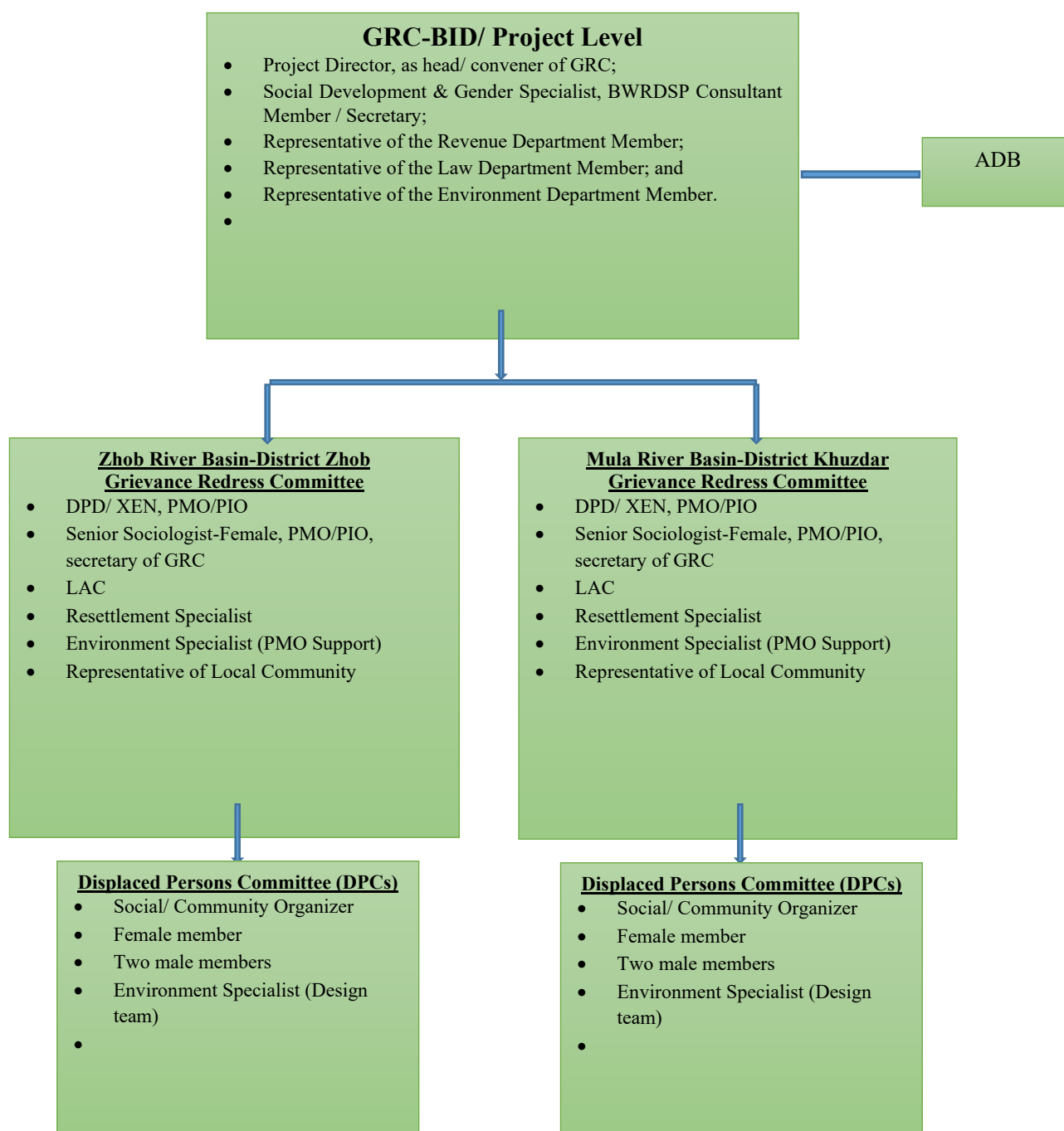

7 CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

7.1 Conclusions

40The Balochistan Water Resources Development Project (BWRDP) aims to support the Government in water sector planning, management and investment on water sector

infrastructure in selected river basins. It does not involve any land acquisition or resettlement impacts as the land is already owned by the Government; and The construction activities in unsettled area envisaged to cause “no IR impacts” and no indigenous peoples identified within or nearby of the sub project area and can be classified as **Category “C”** both for IR and IPs.

7.2 Recommendations

- The movement of the labor force of the contractor should be confined within the project boundary so that the disturbance to the surrounding stakeholders is minimal;
- Regular sprinkling of water should be carried out to control the dust emissions during construction;
- The contractor should comply the mitigation measures proposed in the Environmental and Management and Monitoring Plan (EMMP);
- Contractor’s activities should be confined to avoid the public inconvenience; and
